



- 1. You will need the following Cardstock to complete this project.
  - a. Real Red Cardstock 8 ½" by 5 ½" scored and folded at 4 ¼" and scrap pieces for die cutting
  - b. Smokey Slate Cardstock -- 4" x 5 1/4"
  - c. Crushed Curry Designer Series Paper (DSP) 1" x 4" strips need 3
  - d. <u>Basic White Cardstock</u> 3" x 5" for front layer, 4" x 5 ¼" for inside of card, scrap piece for die cutting
- 2. Using <u>Stazon Jet Black Ink</u> or <u>Memento Tuxedo Black Ink</u> stamp the images of the gas can, the car and the tool box from the <u>Geared Up Garage Stamp set</u> onto the scrap piece of the <u>Basic White Cardstock</u> so that they can be die cut. Set aside to dry.
- Also stamp the sentiment on the <u>Basic White Cardstock</u> piece measuring 4" by 5 ½".
  Again use your <u>Stazon</u> or <u>Memento Ink</u> and stamp the sentiment in the center of the <u>Basic White Cardstock</u>.
- 4. Using Smokey Slate Classic Stamp Pad stamp the oil spot image from the Geared Up Garage Stamp set onto the piece of Basic White Carddtock measuring 3" x 5". You will stamp this image 3 times try to stamp it equal distance and centered on the piece of card stock. Set aside for later.
- 5. Now take the piece of <a href="Smokey Slate Cardstock">Smokey Slate Cardstock</a> and the <a href="Brick & Mortar 3D Embossing Folder">Brick & Mortar 3D Embossing Folder</a>. Carefully insert the cardstock into the folder so that it is straight and the brick are going the right direction for the card.
- 6. Using the <u>Stampin' Cut and Emboss Machine</u> and the proper layers run the <u>Brick & Mortar 3D Embossing Folder through the machine.</u>

7. Now using the corresponding dies from the <u>Garage Gears Dies</u> and the <u>Stampin' Cut and Emboss Machine</u> cut out the stamped image of the oil can, the car, and the toolbox. You will also need to cut the pieces for the inside of the card out of the <u>Real Red</u> <u>Cardstock</u>. These include some gears and the piece surrounding the sentiment inside.



- 8. Now using the <u>Real Red</u> and the <u>Crushed Curry Stampin' Write Markers</u> you are going to color the oil can, car, and toolbox. Color the stripe on the oil can, the head lights on the car and the latch on the toolbox using the <u>Crushed Curry Stampin' Write Marker</u>.
- 9. Finish coloring each of the items using the <u>Real Red Marker</u> as you deem appropriate. Once you are finished coloring it is time to assemble the card.
- 10. Using <u>Multipurpose Liquid Glue</u> adhere the <u>Basic White Cardstock</u> measuring 5 ¼" x 4 to the inside of the card. Now adhere the <u>Real Red</u> die cut gears and sentiment surround also using the <u>Multipurpose Liquid Glue</u>.
- 11. Now take the embossed piece of <a href="Smokey Slate Cardstock">Smokey Slate Cardstock</a> and adhere it to the front of the card using the <a href="Multipurpose Liquid Glue">Multipurpose Liquid Glue</a>. Make sure there is an 1/8" border around all sides of the card



- 12. Next adhere the <u>Crushed Curry DSP</u> strips to the front of the card using the <u>Multipurpose Liquid Glue</u>. Try to equally space the strips out over the <u>Smokey Slate</u> piece. The edges of the strips will line up with the edges of the <u>Smokey Slate</u> piece on the left and right sides.
- 13. Now adhere the <u>Basic White</u> piece measuring 3" x 5" with the oil spill spots stamped on it. This piece should be centered on the card front left to right with about an 1/8" border of the <u>Smokey Slate</u> showing at the top and bottom of the card.
- 14. To finish the card adhere the oil can, car, and tool box to the front of the card using <a href="Stampin' Dimensionals">Stampin' Dimensionals</a>. Center each stamped and colored image over each of the stamped oil spots.
